Impact of Provision

All children are participating in PE and the uptake for After School Multi Sports is high. Analysis of attendance at After School Multi-Sports indicates that there is a high level of uptake with Pupil Premium and SEND in Key Stage 2. Specific children in Key Stage one are targeted to attend. Assessment of children's PE skills has improved. Improved behaviour in the playground as a result of lunch time staff planning games and sports activities.

All pupils have the opportunity to focus on key skills in gymnastics and games with a specialist coach for one of their 60-minute PE lessons in the week.
